WHAT WE'RE LEARNING

God made a promise to Abraham in the Bible (Genesis 13:14-18; 21:1-6; 22:1-18) to bless him and his family, even when it seemed impossible. Abraham trusted God, and God kept His promise! Just like God kept His promises to Abraham, we can trust Him to keep His promises in our lives too.

CONVERSATION STARTERS

WHAT WE'RE LEARNING

WHAT WE'RE LEARNING

Jacob and Esau were brothers, but they didn't always get along. Jacob made mistakes, and Esau felt hurt and angry. Things were broken between them, but God had a plan. Over time, God helped them forgive each other and be friends again.

Even when our hearts or lives feel broken, God can make things new!

Fun Fact

The Bible has many stories about healing! The Lost Son: A son made bad choices and left his family. When he came home, his father welcomed him with love instead of anger. This story shows how God is always ready to forgive and restore broken relationships.

CONVERSATION STARTERS

1. What do you think was the hardest part for Jacob and Esau — forgiving or asking for forgiveness? Why?
2. Have you ever had a friendship or relationship feel “broken”?
3. What's one way you can ask God to help heal something broken in your life this week?

BOTTOM LINE

God can heal broken things!
