Kinsmen Redeemer (Ruth 4)

ICEBREAKER

What are you asking Santa for this year?

Introduction

- The Book of Ruth begins with tragedy and death, but it ends with a love story and redemption. As a matter of fact, the entire Bible is a love story with a happy ending. Have you ever considered this before, or is this a new concept? How do you feel about looking at the Bible this way?
- In the first part of the book, Ruth and Naomi were poverty stricken. They lost everything and were as poor as poor can be, but they were redeemed in the end. How does this parallel our lives as lost people redeemed by God?
- The definition of "redeem" is to buy back. How did God redeem you? What was the cost? How were you changed? How can you keep it going and redeem others?
- You have to be willing to ask for redemption, just as Ruth boldly asked Boaz for hers. Did you boldly ask God for your redemption through Jesus? Why or why not?

The Near Kinsman (v. 1-5)

- We live in a culture that says, "Give me what's best for ME and do it NOW." Do you wait for the right moment in God's timing, or do you rush ahead and try to "help" God? If God's timing is perfect, why do we do this?



- When Boaz presented the land, the near kinsman initially wanted it. However, when he heard Ruth came with it as a wife, he declined it. Philippians 2:3 tells us to consider others above ourselves, but this kinsman did not do that. Have you ever failed to consider someone else above yourself? How did that work out for each of you?
- The near kinsman didn't want to take Ruth as his wife because of the risk. Have you ever failed to trust God's plan because there was too much risk? What happened?
- Boaz went to the gate, which was a neutral place with witnesses, to wait for the near kinsman to arrive. Who do you need to meet in a neutral place with witnesses, in order to help heal someone and facilitate their redemption?

The Kinsman Must be Willing to Redeem (v. 6-12)

- The near kinsman was not willing to sacrifice himself in order to redeem Ruth. Boaz understood this and did it quickly, redeeming Ruth at his own cost and sacrifice. Jesus did the same thing when He redeemed us. With so many examples of redemption, why are we often unwilling to sacrifice ourselves in order to redeem someone else?
- God is weaving through your life and he has a plan (a Boaz) to redeem your life. All we have to do is stay the course and wait for God to provide. Why is it so tempting to look for the next best thing, instead of waiting on God's plan and His timing?
- Boaz was willing to redeem Ruth. Who are you willing to sacrifice and accept risk for in your life? What selfish things are you willing to give up in order to build someone's relationship with God? What are you NOT willing to give up?
- Who in your life was willing to redeem you? Is there someone who has been willing to walk with you through certain situations? Please share.



The Kinsman Must be Able to Redeem (v. 13-22)

- When Naomi was widowed, God was at work. When Ruth lost her husband, God was at work. When Boaz redeemed Ruth as her husband's kinsman, God was at work. When Ruth and Boaz had a child named Obed (who would be the father of Jesse, the father of David), God was at work. How does it make you feel to know this was all God's plan?
- God continues to work all around us every day, in both good and bad times. God has a plan and He is at work in your life, just like he was in Ruth's. Where can you see God at work in your life?
- Consider what it would be like to be Boaz in this book of the Bible... How could you be as selfless and serve others for the long haul? What is something you could do for others, like Boaz did for Ruth and like Jesus did for all of us?
- You have a Boaz. His name is Jesus. What is something you need to sacrifice in order to start serving God? How will you do that today?
- How can you become a Boaz to the people surrounding you? At church? At work? At school? At home?



ACT ON IT



ENCOURAGE

Ruth gives us a picture of the church, Boaz gives us a picture of Christ, and Naomi is a representation of the Holy Spirit. Ruth is an expression that God can work without miracles. God was at work the entire time. But notice how God was at work. Everyone was looking out for the other – it all happens in the context of relationships. God is not just willing to redeem you, but is able to redeem you. He is able to lift us up when we are down. His power to redeem is beyond our understanding, but it is real. The world we live in tells us to strive and go after it ourselves, but as Christians, we get to trust that God is in control, He will redeem, and He will provide.



ASK

What do you need God to redeem? Do you struggle with seeing the Bible as a love story? Where have you been working ahead of God? Where do you need to trust His timing? What relationships in your life is God working through, to get to you?



CHALLENGE

The Book of Ruth invites us to do the following: Don't make commitments too hastily, practice loyalty, learn servanthood, practice hospitality, and obey legitimate authority. Who can you be a servant to this week? We've also learned to have hope and trust in times where we don't know what's next. Share a time where God has shown up for you unexpectedly this week.

Prayer

God, thank You for Your Word. Thank you for all that You have taught us through this amazing story the past few weeks. Thank You for showing us that You are a good Father who is always working in our lives all of the time, even when we don't see You working. Thank You for everything You have blessed us with, and we thank You for the blessings to come. Guide us this week, Lord. Help us to see the ways You are weaving our lives together and redeeming us so we can give You thanks. Thank You Jesus for being our Boaz. Forgive us for the times we've given up. Give us the strength and perseverance to make it through the hard times, and the awareness and gratefulness to keep You present in the good times. Show us who in our lives we can support and redeem. Use us to do extraordinary things in ordinary ways. We praise You, and we thank You. Amen.



Week of November 19, 2023

Just Ask (Ruth 3)

ICEBREAKER

What's your favorite thing to eat at Thanksgiving dinner?

Introduction

- What are your thoughts on worship not being about you and your emotions, but rather giving praise to God? Does this change your posture?
- How do you feel about raising your hands in worship?

Be Bold (v. 1-9)

- Do you approach scripture through a worldly or biblical perspective? Do you think about descriptive and prescriptive when reading through scripture? Do you look at scripture through your own lens or through the purpose of the actual scripture?
- How do you view boldness? Do you have a negative or positive viewpoint when thinking about being bold?
- Ruth was bold going to Boaz but also had a posture of humility. What would it look like for you to have biblical boldness? How does this boldness look different than worldly boldness?
- What is a time that you knew you needed change in your life, but you weren't willing to actually ask God for it? What is the reason for this? (fear, pride, etc.)
- What is a need in your life that you haven't asked the Lord for?



Trust the Timing of God's Process (v. 10-13)

- Do you struggle with God answering you on His timing? Share a time that God answered after a long time of praying.
- When is a time that you didn't wait on God and decided to do something on your own? How did it work out? What was the end result?
- How do you practice waiting for God's timing? Take some time to share with the group.
- What qualities or character traits make Ruth a virtuous woman? How do those help Ruth in waiting for God's process?

Let God Bring Restoration (v. 14-18)

- God's plan for restoration is Jesus. How do you allow the Lord to bring restoration in your life?
- In what areas of your life do you need to let God be the redeemer for you?
- Providence is where God works through regular ordinary events. Do you believe in God's providence for your life? When have you seen God's providence in your life?



ACT ON IT



ENCOURAGE

We know that discounts and deals are available everywhere, but we have to seek them out. We have to go find them. We have to ask for them. The same concept goes for the things that God has for us. The Lord wants to give us spiritual blessings, but we have to step out, be bold, and ask for it. There are areas in your life where God wants you to be bold and step out and ask Him for what you need. But also, when we ask God for His help, we have to be willing to submit to the timing of His process. Lay aside your own emotions and personal gain and submit to the Lord's process in it all. Only then can God bring restoration to the situation for which you need. Only then can we walk in the providence of God, where we allow him to work in both miraculous ways and in ordinary events.



ASK

What area(s) do you need God to redeem in your life? Where is the Lord calling you to be bold? Are you needing a change but aren't willing to put yourself out there and ask for it? Do you trust God's process and timing? Are you trying to make things happen in your timing?



CHALLENGE

Ask God to cover your life and provide for you and make you a part of his family.

What has God been asking you to be bold in? Take a step this week to be bold to do that.

Prayer

God, thank You for your Word. Thank You for another amazing message from the Book of Ruth. Thank You for the reminder and encouragement for us to be bold in our faith. Thank You for showing us through Ruth's story, You love us and want to redeem us. When we need Your help, may we be reminded of Your Word in Matthew 7:7 - That if we ask, it will be given. If we seek, we will find, and if we knock, the door will be opened. Lord, with boldness and courage, we ask You to be our Redeemer. Give us the strength to be bold enough to lay whatever we're dealing with at Your feet and submit it to Your timing and Your process. Ruth trusted the Lord's timing and process through it all. Help us to do the same. Helps to become people of virtue, people who are patient, trusting, and willing to set aside preferences for the great good that You will provide for us. Help us to make room to allow You to bring restoration to the areas in our lives that need it. Bring healing to our brokenness. Show us what to do so that we can walk in Your providence. Forgive us, wash us clean. You love us, You have plans for our lives, and You want to make it possible for us to live it out. For that, we thank You and we praise You. Amen.

Week of November 12, 2023

Walk in Faithfulness, Experience God's Favor (Ruth 2)

ICEBREAKER

Would you rather have a theme song for your life or a constant soundtrack playing in the background?

Introduction

- When was the last time you stepped out on faith? What happened?
- God desires to pour out His blessings and favor on your life! Do you believe 100% that God desires that? Why or why not?
- In last week's sermon, we saw that Naomi decided to be bitter at God. She even changed her name to Mara, which means "bitter." Have you or someone you knew ever felt like this? What did you (or they) turn to in order to get over it? How did it turn out?

Trust in God's Plan and God's Process (v. 1-9)

- How is your faith different now than when you first became a Christian?
- Ruth found herself submitted to God's plan for provision. She was new to following God's law, but trusted His plan and process. And the Lord blessed that! Look at your own life. Did you follow God's plan during a difficult time? How did it work out?
- Ruth needed protection and provision, and God put Boaz in her path to provide it. Have you ever been faced with a difficult situation with no way to provide for or protect yourself? Did you follow God's process in order to get to His provision and protection? Why or why not?



- Boaz didn't treat Ruth like a stranger, but greeted her as "daughter." How do you greet strangers? Is this how you would want to be greeted?
- What emotions and assumptions do you think of with the word "relative"? Would you greet a stranger as a relative?
- How is Boaz's relationship to God reflected in the way that he treats Ruth?
- Boaz was seen as a worthy man, in which God used as a vessel to show God's faithfulness to Ruth and Naomi. Boaz went against social norms in the way he presented himself. How can we use that as an example in our lives?

Your Faithfulness Makes a Difference for You (v. 10-14)

- Ruth asked, "Why am I favored!???" And Boaz directly connects her blessings to her faithfulness and obedience to God! There is a connection to the way you live your life and the blessings you receive. How are you living your life and how might God bless you for this?
- If you remain faithful to God, He will show you favor and blessing, and He will do that through others! Who is paying attention to the way you live your life? What do they see? How are your actions a reflection of your faithfulness to God?
- Do you try to remind God of your disqualifications when He tries to bless you?
- Ruth calls herself a servant. Do you take this humble attitude or what attitude do you go through life with?
- Referring to Ruth 2:11-12, how does this reflect God's care for us?
- Do you expect your rewards to be proportionate to your output?

God Blesses Faithfulness (v. 15-23)

- Look at your own life and the way you lead it every day. Are you faithful and obedient like Ruth? Or, do you rebel and resist God's will? How do you think that influences the blessings you receive?



- Are you living an obedient and faithful life to the Lord? Better yet, are you living your Christian life in such a way that you're positioning yourself to be a recipient of God's blessings? How can/does God see this?
- Have you taken the time to realize what God's blessings are? Who gets the credit for your hard work? You or God?
- How do you affirm the faithfulness you see in others around you?
- Naomi describes Boaz as a family redeemer. Who are the people who have been your redeemers and who have you been a redeemer for?
- Does God's desire to bless you seem like a concept or reality for you?
- Naomi was bitter until she heard about the blessings of Ruth through Boaz. How can your faithfulness be a blessing to others who you may never see?



ACT ON IT



ENCOURAGE

When we're walking with God, being faithful and obedient to His Word, He desires to bless us and to pour out His favor on our lives. And while this isn't a formula for us to perform and earn blessings from God, there is a connection between God's favor and us living faithful and obedient lives. We won't always know the plan, but what we can trust in is that when we seek God and submit to His process, it positions us to receive His provision and protection. When we walk in faithfulness, God shows us favor and blessing either directly from Himself or through the people He's placed in our lives. Not only does God take notice of our faithfulness, but people around us are watching, too. So are you living obedient and faithful to God? Or expecting Him to bless you as you make your own path?



ASK

Are you living an obedient and faithful life to the Lord? Are you living in a way that you're positioning yourself to be a recipient of God's blessings? Is there anything getting in the way of your faithfulness? What would help you stay faithful in difficult times? How can you start to implement that?



CHALLENGE

Keep this list and ask yourself these questions at the beginning and end of each day this week:

How is your devotion life? - Prayer, worship, time in God's Word?

How is your Church life? - Church attendance, small group, giving, serving, praying for your church?

How is your private life? - Do your influences, struggles, screen time reflect your devotion to God?

How are your relationships? - Who's pushing you toward the Lord? Forgiveness? Purity? Humility? Faithfulness?

Prayer

Lord, we thank You for this word today. Thank You for Ruth's example of faithfulness. Ruth wasn't trying to earn anything, she was just living faithful to her promises. She trusted Your process and positioned herself to receive Your provision and protection. God, help us do the same. When we don't know what to do, help us find peace and comfort in trusting You to be Lord over all. Help us to seek Your Word and Will no matter what it is we're walking through. Transform our hearts so that we don't see faithfulness and obedience as tools to get what we want, but rather as a way to give thanks and praise and worship You for all that You are and do, even when we don't see it. Whatever stands in the way of our faithfulness and obedience to Your Word, reveal it and give us the strength to remove it. Empower us to position ourselves in a way to be recipients of your favor. And help us, too, to reflect the grace of Boaz to others as well. Give us spirits of generosity and use us as Your conduits of blessings for those around us walking in your faithfulness. We submit to You and ask all of this in Your Heavenly Name, Amen.

Week of November 5, 2023

God Will Be With You Through Pain (Ruth 1)

ICEBREAKER

If you could live anywhere in the world for a year, where would it be?

Introduction

- How do you respond to pain in life? Fight, flight, or freeze? Why?
- Recall the last time you faced pain or a serious trial. What were some of the biggest questions you had?

Sometimes Life is Really Painful (v. 1-5)

- If someone asked you, "Why does God allow bad things to happen to good people?" How would you respond?
- Do you recognize things that have led you to your own pain? What guardrails do you have in place, or need to put into place, to keep you from being hurt again?
- Life can be really hard sometimes. Sometimes we just don't get to know the "Why". Is there a "Why" that you are struggling with because you don't have the answers? How have you been dealing with that?

Pain Pushes Us in Many Ways (v. 6-18)

- What are the things you run to during grief or loss?
- Do you push people away during a hard time or run to something/someone familiar? Explain.
- Have you ever experienced a loss or tragedy that caused you to move away from God? What drew you back? Or is this something you're still working through?



We Need Each Other When It's Really Hard (v. 19-22)

- Who are your go-to people for sound advice and wisdom during loss/grief/crisis? Do these people build you up or just tell you what you want to hear? What's the difference?
- Is it natural for you to hide from people when you are going through something hard? What is the reason for this?
- Share a time where someone/people rushed into your life to help you deal with pain. What did that show you? What did you learn from that?

God is NOT Absent in Your Pain (v.22)

- God directed Naomi home during the time of harvest so He could provide for her. Have you ever allowed your pain to lead you away from a harvest that God was leading you to?
- What keeps you from clinging to the Lord in hard times?
- Share a time where you were able to see God working, even though you were in pain. Or maybe you're in that season now. Can you see His Hand?



ACT ON IT



ENCOURAGE

Pain is a part of living in a broken world. It's inevitable, and we have to decide how we're going to respond to it. Are we going to run, give up, or fight? It's easy to forget when the going gets tough, but remember, we are overcomers in Christ! Just because we have to walk through painful times doesn't mean that pain gets to win over us. Naomi allowed her circumstances to make her bitter, but that didn't stop God from continuing to provide for her and Ruth. And He will do the same for us, through His Church, His people, and His Hand. So don't let your pain push people away or push God away. God is never absent from us, especially in our time of need. So when we don't know who or what to trust, we can trust that even when we don't see or feel it, God is working to provide for us. Always.



ASK

Spend some time this week asking God to reveal pain that you may be holding onto and people you have pushed away because of that pain. Have you allowed this pain to limit you? Has this pain affected other areas of your life? What would it look like for others to help you out? How have you allowed God to restore you from your pain? How can you use your pain to help others? Who needs you to be a Ruth for them right now?



CHALLENGE

Share a recent pain or a pain you've been holding on to with someone in your small group or someone you trust to point you back to Jesus this week. Ask them to pray with and for you about this. Is there someone else you need to seek out for help with this? We have an entire Care Team ready and waiting to connect with you 1-on-1 at lifepointchurch.tv/care.

Prayer

God, we thank You for this story of Naomi and Ruth in Chapter 1. Thank You for teaching us more things about You and for showing us more of who You are. Thank You for never abandoning us in our time of need. Thank You for continuing to provide for us, even when we don't see it. Thank You for seeing us and hearing us. Help us to trust in You, that You will continue to provide and direct us through difficult times. Help us not to push people away when we're hurting, but to embrace them as the gift from You that they are. And move us to rush into the lives of others and help them in their time of need. We want to be like Ruth, clinging to those who are hurting while bringing support, prayer, encouragement, and healing as needed. Thank You for intervening for us and loving us well when we don't have the strength to love ourselves. Keep our hearts soft, remove bitterness that may dwell there, and rush our lives with those You have placed in our lives to help Your Will be done. Open our eyes to the work You're doing in our lives. Amen.
